

FAMILY SHABBAT TABLE GUIDE

1. Tzedakah אַדַקה

As your final act before Shabbat begins, you might put some coins in your family's tzedakah box and talk about ways you can help those in need.

2. Candle Lighting הַדְלַקַת נֶרוֹת

Light the candles, cover your eyes and say:

ַבָּרוּדְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר קִדְשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו וְצִוָּנוּ לְהַדְלִיק וֵר שֶׁל שַבָּת

Baruch atah A-donai e-loheynu melech ha'olam asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu l'hadlik ner shel Shabbat.

Blessed are You, Source of Light our God, the sovereign of all worlds, who has made us holy with your mitzvot, and commanded us to kindle the Shabbat light.

3. Family Blessings בַּרְכוֹת הַמִּשְׁפָּחָה

Parents may whisper personal words of love and blessing to each child as they place their hands on their children and say these prayers:

For sons:

יִשִּׁימִדּ אֱלֹהִים כָּאֶפְרַיִם וְכִמְנַשֵּׁה.

Y'sim'cha elohim k'efrayim v'chim'nasheh. May you be like Ephraim and Menashe.

For daughters:

יִשִּׁימֵדְ אֱלֹהִים כִּשַּׁרָה רְבָקָה רַחֶל וְלֶאַה.

Y'simech elohim k'Sarah, Rivkah, Rachel v'Leah. May you be like Sarah, Rebecca, Rachel, and Leah.

For all children:

יְבָּרֶכְךּ ה' וְיִשְׁמְרֶדְּ. יָאֵר ה' פָּנִיו אֵלֶידְ וִיִחְנֶּדְ. יִשֵּׂא ה' פַּנַיו אֵלִידְ וַיַשֵּׁם לִדְּ שַׁלוֹם.

Y'varechecha A-donay v'yish'm'recha.

Ya'er A-donay panav elecha viy'chuneka.

Yisa A-donay panav elecha v'yasem l'cha shalom.

May God bless you and guard you.

May God's presence shine on you and be gracious to you.

May God's presence rise toward you and give you peace.

4. Kiddush for Shabbat Eve קדושׁ לֵיל שַׁבָּת

Raise the kiddush cup full of grape juice or wine and say:

(וַיָּהִי עֶרֶב וַיְהִי בֹקֶר)

יוֹם הַשִּׁשִּׁיּ וַיְכֵלּוּ הַשָּׁמַיִם וְהָאָרֶץ וְכָל-צְבָאָם: וַיְכַל אֱלֹהִים בַּיּוֹם הַשְּׁבִיעִי מְלַאכְתּוֹ אֲשֶׁר עָשָׂה וַיִּשְׁבַּת בַּיּוֹם הַשְּׁבִיעִי מִכָּל-מְלַאכְתּוֹ אֲשֶׁר עָשָׂהּ וַיְבָרֶךְ אֱלֹהִים אֶת-יוֹם הַשְּׁבִיעִי וַיְקַדֵּשׁ אֹתוֹ כִּי בוֹ שָׁבַת מִכָּל-מְלַאכְתּוֹ אֲשֶׁר-בָּרָא אֱלֹהִים לַעֲשׁוֹת:

בְּרוּדְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם בּוֹרֵא פְּרִי הַנְּפֵןּי

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם אֲשֶׁר קִדְשָׁנוּ בְּמִצְוֹתָיו וְרָצָה בָנוּ וְשַׁבַּת קַדְשׁוֹ בְּאַהֲבָה וּבְרָצוֹן הְנְחִילָנוּ זִכָּרוֹן לְמֵעֲשֵׂה בְרֵאשִׁית: כִּי הוּא יוֹם תְּחִלָּה לְמִקְרָאֵי קֹדֶשׁ זֵכֶר לִיצִיאַת מִצְרָיִם. כִּי בָנוּ בָחַרְתָּ וְאוֹתָנוּ קִדַּשְׁתָּ מִכֶּל הָעַמִּים וְשַׁבַּת קַדְשְׁךְ בְּאַהֲבָה וּבְרָצוֹן הִנְחַלְתָּנוּ. בְּרוּךְ אַתְּה ה' מְקַדֵּשׁ הַשַּׁבָּת.

(Vayhi erev vayhi voker)

Yom hashishi: Vay'chulu hashamayim v'ha'aretz v'chol tz'va'am. Vay'chal elohim bayom hash'vi'i m'lachto asher asah vayishbot bayom hash'vi'i mikol m'lachto asher asah. Vay'varech elohim et yom hash'vi'i vay'kadesh oto ki vo shavat mikol m'lachto asher bara elohim la'asot. Savrey chaveray.

Baruch atah A-donay e-loheynu melech ha'olam, borey p'ri hagafen.

Baruch atah A-donay e-loheynu melech ha'olam, asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'ratzah vanu v'shabbat kodsho b'ahavah u'vratzon hin-chilanu, zikaron lema'asey v'resheet. Ki hu yom t'chillah l'mikra'ey kodesh, zecher liy'tzi'at mitzrayim. Ki vanu vacharta ve'otanu kidashta mikol ha'amim, v'shabbat kod'sh'cha b'ahavah uv'ratzon hin-chaltanu.

Baruch atah adonay m'kadesh hashabbat.

(And there was evening and there was morning)

The sixth day. Heaven, earth, and all their beings were finished. God completed on the seventh day the work that had been done, and ceased upon the seventh day from all the work that had been done. God blessed the seventh day and set it apart. For on it God had ceased from all the work that had been done in carrying out Creation.

With the approval of my friends,

Blessed are You, The Boundless One our God, the sovereign of all worlds, who creates the fruit of the vine.

Blessed are you Adonai our God, the sovereign of all worlds, who has set up apart with your mitzvot and taken pleasure in us, and with love and favor made the holy Shabbat our possession, a remembrance of the work of Creation. The first of all the holy days proclaimed, a symbol of Exodus from Egypt, your holy Shabbat you have given us to keep in love and favor. **Blessed are You, Adonai, who makes the Shabbat holy.**

5. Handwashing נְטִילַת יַדַיִם

Pour a cup of water on your hands, dry them and say:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלהֵינוּ מֵלֶךְ הָעוּלָם אֲשֵׁר קְדְשַנוּ בִּמְצוֹתָיו וְצְוָנוּ עַל נְטִילַת יָדַיִם:

Baruch atah A-donai e-loheynu melech ha'olam asher kid'shanu b'mitzvotav v'tzivanu al n'tilat yadayim.

Blessed are You, Source of Holiness, the sovereign of all worlds, who has made us holy with your mitzvot, and commanded us to wash our hands.

6. Blessing over Bread אָמוֹצִיא

Uncover the challot and say:

בָּרוּדְ אַתָּה ה' אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶדְ הָעוֹלָם הַמּוֹצִיא לֶחֶם מִן הָאָרֶץ:

Baruch atah A-donai e-loheynu melech ha'olam hamotzi lechem min ha'aretz. Blessed are You, Bountiful, the sovereign of all worlds, who brings forth bread from the earth.

8. Birkat Hamazon/Blessing after the Meal ງ່າເລັກ ກົວກຸລຸ

To be recited after the meal. This is a brief version. See a siddur or Shabbat booklet for more complete versions:

בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, אֱלֹהֵינוּ מֶלֶךְ הָעוֹלָם, הַזָּן אֶת הָעוֹלָם כֵּלוֹ בְּטוּבוֹ בְּחֵן בְּחֶסֶד וּבְרַחֲמִים. בָּרוּךְ אַתָּה יְיָ, הַזָּן אֶת הַכּל.

עֹשֶׂה שָׁלוֹם בִּמְרוֹמָיו, הוּא יַעֲשֶׂה שָׁלוֹם עָלֵיְנוּ וְעַל כָּל יִשְׂרָאֵל, וְעַל כָּל יוֹשְׁבֵי תֵבֵל, וְאִמְרוּ אָמֵן.

Baruch atah A-donai e-loheynu melech ha'olam, hazan et ha'olam kulo b'tuvo b'chen b'chesed uv'rachamim. Baruch atah A-donai, hazan et hakol.

Oseh shalom bim'romav hu ya'aseh shalom aleynu v'al kol yisrael, v'al kol yosh'vey tevel, v'imru amen.

Blessed are You, Bountiful, the sovereign of all worlds; you feed the world in goodness, favor, kindness, and mercy. Blessed are You, A-donai, who nourishes all.

May the maker of peace in the heavens make peace for us and for all Israel, and for all who dwell on earth, and we say Amen.
